Car Rider Information

Please enter the WESTSIDE lot (near the gym), and drive forward as far as possible. **Please stay in line and stay in your car. Do not pass cars in front of you.** Please drive slowly. The safety of our children is of our utmost concern. If your child arrives to school by car, they can be dropped off between 7:53 – 8:03 a.m. Since school begins at 8:00 a.m., the car rider doors will be closed at 8:03 am. Once the car rider doors are locked at 8:03 a.m., parents will need to enter through door #1 in order to drop off and sign in their student. This assures that the student is not on the day's absence list. Car riders must be picked up between 3:00 and 3:05 p.m. at the same location.

News About Pike's Back to School Plan

Based on the current data for Marion County and the guidelines adopted by the MSD of Pike Township School Board, we anticipate that we will be able to resume in-person instruction for students who selected the in-person/remote learning option on Tuesday, September 8th. Our elementary school students will attend school on Schedule A, meaning all in-person/remote learning students will attend school in-person five days a week, while middle and high school students will attend school on Schedule B, which is a Hybrid Model recommended by the Marion County Public Health Department. Under Schedule B, middle and high school students with last names that begin with the letters A-J will attend school in-person on Mondays and Tuesdays and attend school virtually on Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Middle and high school students with last names that begin with letters K-Z will attend school virtually Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays, and will attend school in-person on Thursdays and Fridays.

Loving Care Learning Pods will remain open to serve sixth grade students on their scheduled virtual learning days. Loving Care's before and after school program will resume operation on September 8th. Please call (317) 388-7842 for additional information about Loving Care Child Care services.

Families who selected the virtual attendance option will continue participating in the virtual school option for the remainder of the first semester. All families will have an opportunity to re-evaluate their selection prior to second semester. Should conditions change, families will receive two weeks' notice prior to a schedule change per the Marion County Public Health Department order. This would not include any quarantines or emergency closures directed by the Marion County Public Health Department.

MSD Pike Township Elementary Dress Code

Slacks/Shorts:

Navy, black, khaki, pants or walking shorts (knee-length) and belt. Pants must be properly fitted.

Shirts: Short or long sleeved solid polo or oxford shirts:

Red, white, blue (light blue or navy), or forest green (no stripes or prints)

Sweaters/Sweatshirts (without hoods):

Solid color sweaters and sweatshirts may be worn that are uniform colors – red, white, blue, forest green

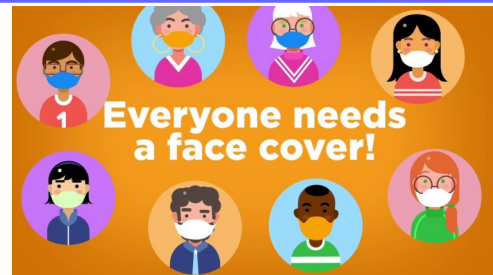
Shoes: Appropriate gym shoes – black or white are preferred (Shoes may have uniform colors on them – red, white, blue)

Not permitted: neon colors or non-uniform colors
Not permitted: opened-toed shoes/sandals or shoes with rollers or lights

Outerwear/Coats:

Jackets and coats are of parents' choice but may not be worn in the classroom. Only uniform attire including sweaters and sweatshirts are acceptable clothing in the building.

Girls: May also wear navy, black, or khaki jumpers, skirts, skorts or Capris (finger-tip length or longer).



MSD Pike Elementary Face Covering Guidelines*

- Face coverings are required to ride the bus.
- Face coverings are required while entering or exiting the building, and while passing in hallways.
- Face coverings are not required for outdoor recess during physical activity; Required for indoor recess
