Take a trip back in time and discover Colonial Williamsburg with the discounted rates on general admission tickets. This offer can only be redeemed at a walk-up ticket window.

4. Shedd Aquarium in Chicago

Teachers in Illinois, Indiana, Michigan and Wisconsin are eligible for one free general admission ticket with a valid school ID. Register online in advance to receive your pass. Educators outside these four states can receive \$3 off their admission by presenting a valid school ID or current paystub to the cashier. The aquarium is at 1200 S.
